Administrative History

This finding aid was created under the auspices of the Canadian Council of Archives' Control of Holdings Program during the 1996-97 academic year. It is designed to facilitate access to a significant resource in the University Archives, the photographs relating to the University of King's College. As photographs are added to the collection, this finding aid will be expanded and new fonds and series may be added.

The archival photograph collection of the University of King's College was assembled over several decades. Various donors, including University Librarians and departments, deposited photographs in the Library and Archives. However, until they were arranged and described during this project and this finding aid was produced, the photographs were largely inaccessible to researchers.

The photographs, with the exception of the yearbook pictures, have been described to the item level, using the Rules for Archival description. Light cleaning was done in a few instances, but no other conservation work has been undertaken on the photographs. After being described, each photograph was enclosed in an acid-free envelope or other appropriate protective container or holder, which was labelled with the photograph's item number. The photographs were then placed in boxes on shelves in the secure climate- and light-controlled Archives storage area of the University Library.

Concurrent with the preparation of this finding aid, photocopies were made of each described photograph, for use as a reference tool in conjunction with the finding aid, in order to protect the original photographs from undue handling.

Scope and Content

The collection consists of approximately 9,480 photographs [b&w and col. prints, b&w and col. negs., col. trans. and col. slides] created, collected and used by the University of King's College.

The photographs in the University of King's College collection have been arranged into seven fonds. Of the seven, five fonds were created or collected by the University as a corporate body, or by University students. These are:

There are skips in the numbering system in certain sections to allow for later insertion of photographs where none are available at the time of compiling this finding aid.

Other photographs of the University of King's College are available at the Public Archives of Nova Scotia, University Avenue, Halifax, N.S.

Administrative History

Series consists of single portrait photographs by various professional photographers.

The photographs were deposited in the Archives by various donors over several decades. Some of the photographs accompanied job applications and were removed from files in the Central Filing System fonds by the Assistant Archivist when those files were arranged and described in 1994.

Scope and Content

Series consists of formal posed portrait photographs of prominent members of the King's College community, or of people associated with the University. The photographs are primarily black and white prints showing the head and shoulders of the subject.

The photographs are arranged in alphabetical order by the name of the subject. When the subject's name is not known, the photographs are arranged chronologically. The call number for the photographs in this series is derived by adding the subject's name after the designation UKC.P.1.1. When the person is unidentified, the date of the photograph is substituted for the name.

The following notes were taken by Jane Reagh Bruce-Robertson (Dean of Residence at the time of writing) during a conversation with Belle

Dauphinee, November, 1994:

Vera Hackenley (nee Dauphinee) was Dean of Women at the University of King's College from 1945 to 1951. She was born in 1901 in Hacketts Cove, N.S., and died of breast cancer in 1952. She trained as a nurse at the Victoria General Hospital in Halifax and became nurse in charge of the Pavilion. She married Archbishop Hackenley (Rector of Hackett's Cove [ca.1910). He died of a heart attack after they had been married three years.

Vera's father, Oswald Dauphinee, ran a general store and post office in Hackett's Cove. His grandparents, Jacob and Hannah Boutlier, were among the earliest settlers in Hackett's Cove. They had two daughters, Hannah and Isabel, who married John George Dauphinee. Vera's father Oswald was the son of John George Dauphinee. The Dauphinee family were French Huguenot, from Montpellier, near the

Swiss border.

John Gibbons, Vera's maternal grandfather, was of Empire Loyalist descent and was one of the first graduates of the Teachers' College in Truro. Clara, his daughter and Vera's mother, also graduated from the Teachers' College.

Vera was one of 11 children of Oswald Boutlier and Clara Gibbons: Mabel (married Walter Bayer), Cyril, Hazel, Annie, Stanley (died in World War I, aged 19), George (wounded in World War I), Vera, Laura, Eleanor, Guy, and Bollo

Laura, Eleanor, Guy and Belle.

Administrative History

These photographs were taken by professional photographers of the graduating classes of King's College students, of the student body on various formal occasions, and of the Foundation Year Program tutorial groups.

The photographs were deposited in the Archives as separate items by various donors over several years.

Scope and Content

The collection consists primarily of large boards with individual portrait photographs taken by professional photographers mounted on them. It is organized chronologically.

Title based on contents of collection.

Many of the older photographs consist of black and white print head and shoulder portraits of individual students, most of whom are wearing academic gowns and hoods. The portraits are trimmed into oval or diamond shapes, with from eight to 20 mounted on each board. Words on scrolls and the University seal are also photographed: "King's College," and the year, and the names of the individual students are under their portrait. Some of the boards also have photographs of the Windsor or Halifax campus and buildings and of faculty members in a group.

In this group of photographs there are also posed groups of students wearing academic gowns and, in many cases, mortarboards. Included in this collection are photographs of groups of students, faculty and staff, usually posed on the steps of the main building, either at Windsor or at Halifax.

The most recent photographs in the group are color prints of tutorial groups in the Foundation Year Program. These are part of the students' records.

The photographs are arranged chronologically, with the class year incorporated into the call number.

Administrative History

These photographs were taken of formal events organized by the University or attended by members of faculty. Predominant are photographs of the King's College graduation ceremony known as Encaenia, which is the Greek word for "dedication festival." At Oxford University, Encaenia is the annual Commemoration of founders and benefactors. The series also includes photographs of convocation, the granting of honorary degrees, laying of the cornerstone 1928, installation of Chancellor and Presidents, and alumni reunions. Photographs of the 1959 visit of Queen Elizabeth II to the University and the 1995 visit of the spouses of the G-7 Summit leaders to the Library are also included in this series.

The photographs were deposited in the Archives by the President's office and by other donors. Most of the Encaenia photographs arrived in the Archives in large envelopes labelled in the hand of the President's secretary.

The collection consists of photographs of groups of people in academic procession, as well as attending the festive occasions such as balls and dinners associated with the event.

Administrative History

These photographs were taken of the King's College campus buildings, both exterior views and interior scenes, and of landscapes in Windsor. There is also a small collection of photographs taken on and shortly after Feb. 5, 1920, showing the fire that destroyed the College's Main Building on its Windsor campus.

The series also includes two large photographs by noted local photographer W.R. MacAski, famed for his photographs of the schooner Bluenose. These were gifts from the Class of 1940.

The photographs were deposited in the Archives by various donors.

Scope and Content

The photographs consist of black and white and color prints of exterior and interior views of King's College buildings on both the Windsor and Halifax campuses, as well as photographs of landscapes, the location unidentified in a few cases.

Title based on subject-matter of the series.

The photographs are arranged in three subseries:

UKC.P.1.8.W - the Windsor campus;

UKC.P.1.8.F - the transition period, triggered by the fire of 1920, with the resulting move of the College to Halifax and its occupation of a hotel on the Northwest Arm known as Birchdale; and

UKC.P.1.8.H - the Halifax campus.

Within the two campus location subgroups of Windsor and Halifax, the photographs are arranged by building according to the date of construction.

A History of the Buildings of the University of King's College by Brian Boudreau, Archives Assistant March 29, 1997

Over the course of its long history as an educational institution, the University of King's College has taken on many forms. This is as true of its

physical shape as it is of the diverse curriculum it has offered.

The origins of the university could scarcely have been more humble. Upon arriving in the province, the new bishop of Nova Scotia, **Charles Inglis**, sought to "remove the evil" of a "country destitute of the means of education" as quickly as he could. And quickly he did proceed: within a year of his arrival, he officially opened a new **Academy** in Windsor on Nov. 1, 1788. The Academy accommodated 17 pupils in an old farm house leased from the widow of a former Governor.

After founding an institution that would provide students with a rudimentary education, Inglis decided to build a **College** in Windsor. He literally made the plans for the College: besides spear-heading the funding arrangements, he drafted the original specifications, along with all the subsequent modifications, for the construction of the new building. Along the arduous road to its completion, one such modification was necessary because no skilled mason could be found to dress the hewn stone. Inglis then had to draft plans for a predominantly wooden building.

The new building was probably completed early in 1792. It consisted of five bays separated from each other by a three-foot thickness of stone. Over the following decades, these bays, which were for the most part isolated from one

another, served different roles as the university developed.

The bay on the westernmost side of the campus was called **President's**Bay or occasionally, Western Bay. For many years, this bay accommodated

the President and his family.

The bay adjacent to President's Bay came to be known as **Chapel Bay**, since it housed the College's chapel from 1842-1877. Before 1842, the chapel was located on the first floor of the bay at the eastern end of the building. In 1877, the **Hensley Memorial Chapel** was built. This impressive chapel, named after a long-time College professor, librarian and bursar, John Manuel

Hensley, still stands today.

Next to Chapel Bay was Middle Bay, so-called for obvious reasons. But the origin of the name of the bay adjacent to Middle is less obvious--it was called Radical Bay. In their book, All the King's Men, Mark DeWolf and George File suggest it was so named because of the high number of divinity students living there. Next to Radical Bay, on the eastern side of the building, was North Pole Bay. DeWolf and File explain that it was given the name not because it was especially cold, but because the students in the bay were housed on the top floor.

For a number of years, the Library was located below the students (apparently a very quiet bunch) in North Pole Bay. It remained there until 1870, when it was relocated to Convocation Hall (constructed in 1863), where it

shared the new structure with the College Museum.

The first floor of North Pole Bay also played a number of roles. After ceasing to house the Chapel in 1842, the floor was transformed into Commons

Hall, the College's cafeteria and multi-purpose area. In the decade following this addition, the main building, as a whole, received a face-lift. A new gabled

roof and cupola were added in 1854.

As the years passed, the College branched out from the main building, with the addition of Convocation Hall, which was started in 1861 and completed in 1863, when the first Encaenia was held in it, and Hensley Memorial Chapel in 1877. In the next half-century, the campus continued to expand, albeit in a somewhat inelegant fashion. Around 1912, the President drew up rough plans and gave them to a local carpenter, who constructed three new buildings, the Science Building (built in 1912), the women's residence, Alexandra Hall (completed in 1914) and the President's House.

But soon after the addition of these buildings, the growth of King's College, Windsor, would be dramatically reversed. On Feb. 5, 1920, the main building caught on fire. Although it started on one of the extremes of the building (likely set accidentally by the steward's children in North Pole Bay), the fire couldn't be contained. It spread quickly to all parts of the building, sweeping through the area between the newer gabled roof and the old flat roof. The main

building--the heart of the campus--was completely destroyed.

Since all the other buildings remained, along with a substantial connection to the community, the Board of Governors decided to rebuild the college on the Windsor campus. In fact, the administration was so anxious to rebuild in Windsor that a ceremony to lay the cornerstone for the new building was held before any adequate reconstruction plans had been formulated.

In the meantime, students attended classes in two adjoining houses near Windsor high school. They continued in Windsor until the 1923-24 school session, when they began attending classes in Halifax, which became the site for the reincarnation of King's. The administration's change in heart was prompted by a suggestion (and a very generous contribution) from the Carnegie Foundation, which believed that King's should move to Halifax where the College could more readily cooperate with other Nova Scotia universities.

While arrangements were being made to set up in Halifax, King's students were asked to undergo what must have been an awkward transition. Their temporary site, Birchdale, near the Northwest Arm, had served as a hotel for a number of years before it was used to accommodate King's College. King's crammed itself into Birchdale: students, the bursar, and several unmarried professors lived there, above the Chapel's new home in the basement--all the old College facilities except for the Library, which remained in

Windsor for the time being.

During Encaenia celebrations on May 9, 1929, the cornerstone was laid at the new King's site, next to the Dalhousie University campus in Halifax. This cornerstone, unlike the one laid a short while earlier, did eventually become part of a King's College building that was officially opened on Oct. 2, 1930. This building, the present Administration Building, and those attached to it, the President's Lodge, the Chapel, and North Pole Bay, had been designed by Andrew R. Cobb and were generally well-received by the displaced, reminiscent King's community. Cobb's stated intention of emulating the style and dignity of the Windsor buildings was apparent in the appearance of the new buildings.

The division of the campus into bays was perhaps the most apparent example of this effort. Like the architecture in Windsor, the new bays were also structurally isolated from one another, with each having its own entrance, yet they were now connected to one another by an underground tunnel. These new bays borrowed their names from those on the Windsor campus. The familiar-sounding Chapel, Middle, and Radical bays were housed in a building perpendicular to the main building. Over the center doorway of this building (over Middle Bay's door) is a bas-relief of Aeneas and Anchises brought to the new campus from Windsor. The adjacent main building was composed of two bays, North Pole and Alexandra Hall (later named Cochran Bay after King's first president, William Cochran), which flanked the impressive Arts and Administration building. The Library, now larger than ever, occupied the entire third floor of the A&A Building, which also housed the offices of the President, Bursar, and professors, as well as lecture halls. The dining area, Commons Hall, was in the basement of the building. Connected to this structure were the President's Lodge and the new King's College Chapel.

The campus buildings remained almost unchanged for the next three decades, but the activities taking place within their walls changed greatly. The most abrupt change in campus activities took place when the University buildings were made available to the Royal Canadian Navy for the duration of World War II, from 1941-45). During its time as an Officer Training Establishment, "H.M.C.S. King's" 3100 Naval officers were trained for sea

duty on the campus.

The campus itself had to wait for significant changes until the early 1960s. At that point, as the President wrote in 1960, plans were being made "for housing [their] increasing numbers" in the form of a "very ambitious program of development." This project took form in the architectural designs of J. Philip Dumaresq & Associates, whose plans entailed the construction of a new women's residence, gymnasium, and dining hall. But the realization of this plan took until Encaenia of 1963, when Prince Hall (the dining room named after former professor, Samuel Henry Prince) and Alexandra Hall were officially opened. The gymnasium was not finished until several months later.

The construction of the gym and of Alexandra Hall gave the King's Quadrangle its final dimensions. Alexandra Hall sat across the Quad from the building housing Radical, Middle, and Chapel Bays. The gym was adjacent to this building on the side furthest from the A&A (next to Chapel Bay). The three-sided character of the Campus was eventually transformed almost thirty years later with the construction of the new library. This elegant copper-roofed building, designed by Roy Willwerth of the architectural firm of Duffus Romans Kundzins Rounsefell Architects Ltd., was officially opened on May 14,1991, and completed the open-sided Quadrangle, completing the structural transformation of King's College.

Administrative History

These photographs were taken of the University of King's College Library, both exterior and interior views, and its contents. The series includes photographs of the construction of the new Library in Halifax in 1989 There are a number of photographs of "things of consequence" that have been part of the Library's and the University Museum's collections since the latter part of the nineteenth and early part of the twentieth century.

The photographs were deposited in the University Archives in 1991 by the present Librarian and Archivist, Drake Petersen, and various donors.

Scope and Content

The collection consists of photographs of interior views of the Library, including scenes of students studying; of exterior views of the new Library; of interior views of the new Library under construction; and photographs of various objects in the Library's Treasure Room.

A brief history of the Library's various locations on the Windsor and Halifax campuses is included in the finding aid.

A brief description of the various premises the Library has occupied is included in the finding aid.

The Library's Premises

By the 1860s, the Library's collection of 6000 volumes was the largest in the Province and could no longer be maintained in its one-room location in the College's Main Building in Windsor. In 1870, the collection was moved into the gallery of Convocation Hall, which had been built with funds raised by by the Incorporated Alumni and presented to the University. The Museum collection of natural history specimens and artifacts was arranged in five large table cases and 24 flat cases supported by the balustrade surrounding the gallery in Convocation Hall.

Early Calendars noted that in the Library there were a number of photographs and several large oil paintings, including ones of Dr. McCawley, Dr. Cochrane, Rev. Charles Porter, and Paul Mascarene. They also mentioned the marble busts of General Fenwick Williams and of Cicero and Demosthenes,

which are still in the Library.

Fortunately, the Library was not damaged in the fire of 1920 that destroyed the College's Main Building in Windsor. After the University moved to Halifax and the present campus opened in the fall of 1930, the Library was located on the third floor of the Administration building. As the collection grew, the Library expanded to occupy more rooms: there were closed stacks on the second floor of the Administration Building, a basement storage room in the tunnel below the Administration Building to the north of the stairs (used as the Radio Room for the School of Journalism in 1996-97), and periodicals were shelved in the former Smith Library, which is in the basement of Alexandra Hall. At the time of writing, the former Smith Library is being used as the Alumni and Development Office.

In 1989, construction began on the first building the University has ever had that has been dedicated to the Library and the newly-formed University Archives. The new Library, on the east side of the Quad, was opened in 1991.

Administrative History

These photographs were used to illustrate talks about the University that were given at parishes around the Province.

The photographs were deposited in the Archives as separate items from various donors. Some of them were numbered and may have been used as a slide show in parishes throughout the province.

Scope and Content

The collection consists of portrait photographs and photographed pictures from books and of paintings.

Title based on format of collection.

The photographs consist of black and white portraits of individuals and places having a connection to the University. Many of photographs are of engravings or paintings or of pictures in books. Nearly all are labeled, most on a white adhesive label placed along one edge of the slide. Most of the slides have black tape around the edges of the glass.

The slides were in a wooden box 13 cm high x 34 cm wide x 11 cm deep. The box has a leather handle on top and a metal hook that swings into a metal eye to close it. There are three partitions inside the box.

Notes

The number in parentheses following the title of each glass slide was written on that slide, possibly to indicate its position in the showing of the slides.

The slides were probably made ca. 1910-1915.

A few of the slides appear to have been intended for personal use, rather than for promoting the University.

Administrative History

Lewis Billard (B.Sc. 1950, Dip. in Ed. 1951), an amateur photographer, took these photographs between 1946 and 1951 while an undergraduate at King's. While most of the pictures were taken for his own interest, some were commissioned shots. A few were later published in the King's College Record, the student yearbook. Mr. Billard was one of only two students on the King's campus at the time who owned a camera.

Mr. Billard produced the prints in the fonds in 1989, to be displayed at the University's 200th anniversary celebrations. The prints are mounted on 32 x 51 cm colored card, and each card has a handwritten label. On the negative folders, Mr. Billard recorded details of how the photograph was taken, such as aperture setting and shutter speed.

When University President Marion G. Fry asked Mr. Billard to give the prints to the University, he chose to wait until the new Library had been opened in 1991 so the photographs would be stored in the temperature-, light- and humidity-controlled secured space of the Treasure Room. When he delivered the prints to the Archives, he also donated the original negatives. The photographs arrived in the Archives in a black plastic bag bearing a label written on masking tape, "King's 1945-50 - 11 x 14 on matts - 175 printed 1989." On the top of the stack of photographs was a large piece of paper with the handwritten words, "Lew Billard's Look at Kings 1945 (fall) - 1950 (spring)."

Scope and Content

Fonds consists of photographs [b&w prints and negs.] shot by Lewis Billard of his friends and classmates at King's. The fonds includes photographs of social and community events at King's; athletic events; individual and group pictures of people at King's, both posed and candid; and interior and exterior studies of the College buildings, which were designed by Andrew Cobb.

Fonds consists of 2 series. Series 1 consists of b&w prints made in 1989, and Series 2 consists of the original negatives.

There are 512 b&w negatives in tissue folders. All have numbers corresponding to the photographer's arrangement scheme, most have titles and dates, and many have photographic details of shutter speed, f stop and exposure time.

The negatives and their tissue folders were placed into acid-free 12 x 14 cm envelopes that were then placed into an acid-free photographic box and stored in the Archives.

Administrative History

These photographs were of the graduating classes of Canadian Naval officers who trained on the King's College Halifax campus during World War II.

The photographs were loaned to King's by Maritime Command. A few came from other sources.

Scope and Content

The fonds consists of photographs taken by Climo Photography of the graduating classes. The fonds is organized into three related groups, based on the physical arrangement of the material: two albums and several loose photographs. There is also fourth group consisting of a collection of miscellaneous 20 x 24 cm b&w photographs related to the Navy's wartime presence at King's.

Title based on contents of fonds.

Photographs consist of black and white prints, most mounted on board.

Accompanying the photographs was a large envelope addressed to Mary Abbott, HMCS King's Wardroom manager, sent from Turnquist at AGT Advertising and Promotions in Calgary, Alberta. In the envelope were several pages of information, from which the following has been extracted. This information has been placed in five files labelled "HMCS King's" in the Archives.

Many of the photographs have been on long-term loan from the Maritime Command Museum to the Wardroom, the King's College student pub, per agreements dated 9 June and 28 July, 1989.

History of HMCS King's

A brief sketch history of HMCS King's that accompanied the photographs loaned to the University states:

"The close and cordial relationship between the University of King's College and the Royal Canadian Navy which exists today and which is exemplified by the King's College Naval Bursary awarded annually by

the ships and establishments of the Atlantic Command, dates back to the early years of the Second World War.

"It was on 24 May, 1941, that the STADACONA section of the RCN's Officer Training Establishment was transferred to King's College. A few months later, on 1 October, 1941, this school was commissioned as HMCS KING'S. Here young officers took a twelve-week course in gunnery, torpedo, navigation and signals before proceeding to sea. Later the course was lengthened to twenty weeks and modified with a view to placing greater emphasis on anti-submarine operations.

"Training of officers continued at King's until after the war in Europe had ended. When HMCS KING'S paid off on 19 May, 1945, ninety-six classes had been held there

and some 3,100 officers graduated."

By a lease dated 23 May 1941, the Board of Governors of the University of King's College leased to His Majesty the King, represented by the Minister of National Defence of the Dominion of Canada, for \$30,000 per year, "all the lands and buildings known as King's College, being part of the former Studley property on Cobourg Road, except for the President's Lodge, the College general office and the President's office, the College safe-deposit vaults, the College Chapel, and the Library, excepting the Reading Room." The term of the lease was "for the duration of the present war now subsisting between the British Commonwealth of Nations and its allies and the German Reich and its allies, and six months thereafter."

According to an extract from "Report of interview with Commodore O.C.S. Robertson, Royal Canadian Navy (retired) at Oakville, Ontario, Lieutenant Robertson (as he then was) arranged with King's College President Stanley Walker to rent the University premises. The eighteen College students were

moved to Pinehill.

"We were a non-existent ship," said Robertson in the interview. "We didn't exist on paper, it was hard getting stores, it was hard to get anything. Dutchy Edwards, who was at <u>Stadacona</u> at that time, made us <u>Stadacona III</u> so I could demand stores and food and stuff like this. We also had to get staff."

Some of the furniture used in the College came from Ascania, a Cunarder being converted from a passenger liner to an AMC at Vickers in Montreal. Lt. Robertson had 40 sailors collect the furniture and load it on trucks. He then persuaded CNR to ship it to Halifax. "We had enough furniture then to furnish the college, so that we could put 196 temporary probationary acting sub-lieutenants into it--a bit of a crush."

The acting sub-lieutenants at HMCS King's came from every walk of life.

Most of them were in their early twenties, just out of university or jobs. "And we had three to three and a half months to turn out sub-lieutenants, and they were quite amazing," said Commodore Robertson. "Some had difficulty, especially in navigation. They'd never had spherical trigonometry in their lives. We had to teach them in that time. We brought in two professional teachers, Ben Sieverts and Dickie Dickinson...we got the Navy to recruit teachers from universities, colleges, high schools. We taught them navigation and then they taught the sub-lieutenants. They knew how to teach."

Even the College President, Rev. Canon Stanley Walker, would come on an hour's notice and give a lecture on naval history, marine law and other

subjects.

A report on the training of R.C.N.V.R. officers provides the following information:

From September to December, 1939, some officers were trained at Naden and Stadacona. From January to June, 1940, all V.R. officers' training was done in <u>HMCS Stonefrigate</u> at Kingston, Ontario. Three classes of 33 were given an eight-week course.

From April to December of 1940, some officers were sent to <u>King Alfred</u> for training. Between June and September, 1940, some officers were trained in

HMCS Stadacona.

From January 1 until 23 May 23, 1941, officer training was carried out at HMCS Stadacona. The Navigation School operated in the basement of the United Memorial Church on Kaye Street, Halifax. The officers were quartered in

new buildings erected on the Admiralty House grounds.

On May 24, 1941, Officers' Training Establishment, <u>HMCS Stadacona</u> was moved to the buildings of the University of King's College on Coburg Road. The work of the Officers' Training Establishment was carried on, but the establishment was designated <u>HMCS Stadacona III</u>, and was under the charge of then Lieutenant-Commander O.C.S. Robertson, R.C.N.R.

On August 11, 1941, Commander Adrian M. Hope took over <u>HMCS</u> <u>Stadacona III</u>. On October 1, 1941, Officers' Training Establishment was

commissioned HMCS King's under Commander Hope.

Concurrent with the courses in gunnery, navigation, signals and torpedo was a series of lectures given in the evening on subjects such as discipline, the King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions (K.R. & A.I.) and other regulations, pay, clothing, traditions of the service, service documents, medical and first aid.

Late in 1942, a one-week Divisional course was instituted and HMCS Charny was attached to King's as a tender. During this year, a seamanship course began, which included one week of classroom instruction and one week of sea training in Charny. A one-week radar course was instituted in 1943. The courses grew from 12 to 22 weeks' duration.

In the early stages of training at HMCS King's, more than 80 per cent of the officer candidates were drawn from the ranks of civilians and had no

previous military experience. As of May, 1943, more than half the officers came from the ordinary seamen, and a new ruling provided that all officer candidates must first train 22 weeks as ordinary seamen, so in the latter period of HMCS's King's existence, 100 per cent of the personnel were from the "lower deck."

The total number of potential officers trained at HMCS King's was 3103,

in 96 classes. The failure rate was 1.8%.

The file contains a copy of <u>HMCS King's</u> Standing Orders for Officers under Training dated June, 1943, a 38-page document. A list of the classes is also in the file, showing the number in the class, dates each class commenced

and finished, and the names of the staff members and instructors.

The file contains photocopies of clippings from newspapers across Canada, including the Toronto Evening Telegram, the Toronto Daily Star, the Globe and Mail, the Ottawa Citizen, the Montreal Star, the Winnipeg Free Press, the Vancouver Daily Province and the Victoria Daily Times from 1942 to 1944, showing individual pictures of local men who were members of the HMCS King's graduating classes. The file also contains photocopies of several other articles written about HMCS King's at the time.

Administrative History

These photographs were taken of Royal Canadian Navy vessels by official Navy photographers. Most of the photographs are of corvettes that were lost (i.e., sunk) during World War II. The photographs were presented to the University by Maritime Command and originally hung in the student pub in the basement of the Administration Building known as HMCS King's Wardroom. During John Godfrey's tenure as University President (1977-1987), money had been raised to establish the Wardroom, which opened in 1978.

Also in this group are a few photographs of Navy ships and of a Navy training yacht, the Oriole, which may not have been part of the original group presented to the University. There is also a photograph of University President John Godfrey accepting the 24 photographs in 1978.

For archival conservation purposes, Gillian Frances-Barlow, a member of the Library staff, arranged to have the 24 corvette photographs reproduced, framed and matted in 1995 at the request of the University President. The reproductions were rehung in the Wardroom and the originals were deposited in the Archives by the University Archivist, Drake Petersen.

Scope and Content

The photographs consist of black and white prints 19 x 24 cm and mounted on board, with the name of the ship lettered on the board underneath the photograph. Some of the photographs appear to be slightly tinted, but the coloring, if any, is very faint. The surfaces of must of the photographs are alligatored. Most have suffered damage and are waterstained. Each photograph has a number handwritten on the back of the board. Accompanying the group of photographs are pieces of heavy paper enclosed in clear plastic protectors; each piece of paper has a label on it with the name of one of the ships and details of the photograph. This information is included in the list of photographs below.

Two photographs are missing from the collection: HMCS Fraser leaving Vancouver in 1937, DND neg. no. E-2294, Public Archives of Canada neg. no. PA-116982; and the photograph of another ship, unidentified.
